Sisters and brothers in Christ, grace and peace to you from God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ.

On May 19th and 20th our Northwestern Synod gathered for the annual assembly. On the 19th, we gathered at St. Aloysius Catholic Church for a keynote presentation from Dr. Mary Jane Haemig and a joint Roman Catholic/Lutheran Evening Prayer in the Taize style. On May 20th, we gathered at the Bowen Thompson Student Union at BGSU to conduct the business of the assembly, worship, and hear two more keynotes. The Bevingtons have an article later in this newsletter describing their experience. As your pastor, I have to report the business of the assembly.

If you're interested, you can watch any or all of the assembly at <http://nwosassembly.com/video>. I would commend to you the three keynote presentations.

There were five items of business before the assembly. Three of these happen at every assembly: approval of the budget, approval of the proposed compensation guidelines, and the election of members to synod council.

The budget was approved, both amendments for 2017-18 and the proposed budget for 2018-19. My two cents: the Northwestern Ohio Synod has a very lean budget. While the total expenses for the synod are just over \$1.6 million, we still forward 51% of the ELCA Churchwide ministries. This operating on around \$800,000 a year!

The synod council and synod committee vacancies were all filled. All the non-contested ballots were approved by unanimous consent of the assembly *en bloc*. The rest of the nominees were elected by simple majority ballot.

Howard "Ardy" Gonyer (St. Mark's, Bowling Green) as Consultation Committee Lay Member

I encourage you to reach out to Pastor Marshall or Mr. Gardner if you have any questions about the work of our synod, the synod council, or any of the synod's committees.

The two points of business that are not part of every assembly both involved updating the synod's governing documents. At every Churchwide Assembly, updates are made to the *Model Constitution for Synods* and the *Model Constitution for Congregations*. The parts of these constitutions that are required because our non-profit status is through the ELCA Churchwide offices go into effect once adopted for all synod and congregations of the ELCA. Part of these regular updates normally includes updates to the non-required portions of the model constitutions. These portions must be voted on by each synod in assembly and by every congregation.



The last Churchwide Assembly combined the three lay rosters of the ELCA necessitating some language changes throughout the governing documents of all three expressions of our denomination. Most of the changes to the constitution at this year's synod assembly reflect these language changes in the non-required portion of the synod's constitution. As these changes bring the synod constitution in line with the *Model Constitution for Synods*, only one vote was needed to pass.

The last point of business was a significant change to the way the synod functions. Across the ELCA synods are voting on whether or not to try a flexible approach to the timing of synod assemblies. In the constitution of the synod, we could have assemblies every other year, but the bylaws state we must have an assembly every year. The proposed changes to both the constitution and the bylaws offer the possibility of having an assembly every three years with other synod-wide events in the off years. These proposed changes passed overwhelmingly despite several concerns expressed from the floor of the assembly. This is a significant change to the constitution not reflected in the *Model Constitution for Synods* so these changes will have to be ratified at the 2018 Northwestern Ohio Synod Assembly before they go into effect. This year between is a chance to explore the implications of the proposed changes and see if we might need to amend them.

All of this business may sound dull, but the work of the assembly is not just business. There were several workshops and lunch conversations as well as the keynote speakers intended to encourage the people of this synod to build relationships within the synod and beyond. I hope after reading the article from the Bevingtons you might consider going to synod assembly next year to participate in that expression of the ELCA.





2017 North Western Ohio Synod Assembly

May 19-20 BGSU in Bowling Green, Ohio

This year's Assembly, "500 Years of Grace...Then and Now" was unique in several ways. This was Bishop Daniel Beaudoin's and his staff's first Synod Assembly. On Friday, we attended a service of prayer with our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters. And lastly we marked the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation.

On Friday evening at St. Aloysius Catholic Church we gathered to hear keynote speaker, Dr. Mary Jane Haemig who is a Professor of Church History at Luther Seminary. She was engaging, knowledgeable and thought provoking. Her message was titled "Free, Free, Free...For What?" She related that the people during Luther's time were very fearful. Fearful that grace wasn't enough, fearful they weren't doing enough good works, fearful that God was constantly evaluating them and fearful that they weren't measuring up enough to avoid hell or purgatory. Luther at the time had the same fears. However, through his studies and God's mercy, Luther came to realize that **GRACE** is given **freely** by God. Good works were not key but God's Word and faith were!

The evening ended with a prayer service...several repetitive songs along with silent reflective time.

On Saturday, Bishop Beaudoin officially opened the Synod Assembly and gave his report followed by other reports. Everything was pretty straight forward, no major issues.

Dr. Mary Jane Haemig returned as a keynote speaker. Her message was "What Kind of God." This focused on prayer. Luther used Old Testament examples to teach prayer. In Genesis 15:2-6 Abraham is struggling with doubt and despair. For Luther, Abraham is an example of what to do in times of trial – trust God, pour out your complaints to Him and commend your cause to God. Dr. Haemig continued with other examples from the Old Testament that related to prayer. Luther stated a good prayer has three parts. "The first requirement of a good prayer is that it gives thanks to God. The second part is "either the complaint or the mention of need." The third part is to request what you want.

Saturday afternoon, the assembly members voted on the general election. We voted on a few changes in provisions and bylaws to the constitution and we voted to adopt a bylaw change to allow greater flexibility in the scheduling of future NWOS Assemblies. A regular meeting of the Synod Assembly shall be held at least triennially. An assembly will be held in 2018, followed by an Assembly in 2020. There will be no assembly in 2019.

Our assembly ended with a Eucharist service led by Bishop Daniel Beaudoin... His message: "It's time to dance to the beat of a new rhythm...Love God...Love and serve your neighbor!" Amen!

Jim Johnson made a motion to accept the recommendation of Jennifer Parkison and the proposed compensation that of which will be shared equally between Zion and St. Paul. Carla Mitchell seconded the motion, motion carried. Carolyn will be the “Supervisor” for this

position.


