Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Through the season of Easter, we who use the Revised Common Lectionary during worship will read through some highlights of Acts. This corporate liturgical practice is theoretically paired with individual members reading through the book of Acts at home. This theoretical practice has me wondering about our expectations—our expectations for the devotional practices of members, our expectations for corporate worship, and especially our expectations about the work of the Holy Spirit.

There is a thought among the members of Zion that is fairly common among Christians in the United States. It runs something like, “But you never know what the Holy Spirit might do...” While this is true, I usually hear this comment when Christians are faced with having to change something they don’t want to change. Rather than engage in faithful change, many Christians look to the Spirit for some miracle that means we don’t have to change. For Lutherans, this is a particularly problematic thought.

While it is true that the Holy Spirit may surprise us, we in fact know some of what the Holy Spirit will do. The book of Acts is all about what the Holy Spirit does. The Apostles’ Creed tells us what the Holy Spirit does. Luther’s *Small Catechism* expounds on this. Even the *Formula of Concord* reflect on the work of the Holy Spirit.

The *Small Catechism* list is probably the most concise and familiar, so here’s the refresher. The Holy Spirit calls us through the word, gathers us as church, enlightens us through her gifts, makes us holy, and keeps us in the faith.



This probably seems all well and good, but here’s what we miss from Acts that the *Formula* drives home: “God the Holy Spirit does not effect conversion without means...” (FC, Ep. 2.4). What does this mean? The Holy Spirit does not work on her own. Faith does **not** mystically happen in a vacuum. Instead, God needs Christians to proclaim the gospel through word and deed so that when the Holy Spirit moves someone to believe they will know what to believe.

The example of this is the conversion of Lydia in Acts 16. The Spirit moved Lydia to gather with other women in Philippi to worship God on the day when Paul and his companions met with them to tell them the good news about God’s love in Jesus. Lydia’s house becomes the meeting place for the Christians in Philippi. The letter to the Philippians—that book of the Bible—was sent to Lydia’s house! But all this only happened because the Spirit was moving in Lydia’s life **and** Paul proclaimed the good news to her.

The massive growth of the Church in Acts is because the two elements necessary for church growth happened. First, the Spirit was moving. Second, believers told people the good news. And both are necessary. If the Spirit moves but no one proclaims the good news, then those in whose lives the Spirit is moving will not know what to believe. If the Spirit is not moving but the good news is proclaimed, faith will not be possible since the Spirit empowers us to believe the good news.

If we sit back expecting the Holy Spirit to do something to “save” Zion, we have missed the point of how the Holy Spirit works. If we want Zion to grow in faith and in members, then we must share our faith with others. The Holy Spirit needs you to share the good news with others. If you’re waiting for the Holy Spirit to grow the church, her response is, “I’m waiting on you to share your faith.”

You’re probably thinking at this point, “But Pastor Eric, I don’t know what to say.” Believe it or not, this is what we’re trying to help you with at Zion. The Faithful Conversations during Lent gave you a place to start. Talk with people about your favorite hymn and your favorite Bible story. Talk with them about what being a member of Zion means to you. Talk to them about why it’s good news that your sins are forgiven—and so are theirs!

The number one reason people start worshiping at a congregation is because someone they know asked them to go to worship. So how about inviting some people to worship? If your conversations seem to fall on dry ground, then pray for the Holy Spirit to move in the other person’s life and for you to have the right words when the time comes. And take courage that even the apostles faced challenges when proclaiming God’s love for all people in Jesus.

I encourage you to read through Acts, either this Easter season or as part of the Year of Scripture, and pay attention to everything that the early church does to engage in the mission of God. We cannot sit back and expect God to just miraculously fill our pews with new members. If we want to fill our congregation, then we, like the early church, must participate in God mission by sharing our faith with family and friends.

Christ is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

Carolyn's Corner . . .

I've been asked several times recently why I am no longer an Associate in Ministry and now am called a Deacon. The short answer is that the ELCA, when they met in assembly in 2017 voted to combine the three Word and Service rosters into one and to use the Scriptural title of deacon to define our role in the Church. Two deacons mentioned in the Bible are St. Stephen, chosen by the Disciples and Phoebe who was chosen by Paul to extend the work they were doing by serving in their communities.

Through baptism every Christian is called to ministry. Some are called to word and sacrament (pastors) who proclaim the word of God within the gathered community and preside at the Sacrament of Holy Communion. And some are called to word and service (Deacons) where their role is to equip the baptized in their vocation of loving the neighbor. A person who is called to either of these public ministries is not more holy or more special than others; they have discerned a call to a vocation that requires mutual accountability in and with the church and are called to serve where needed.

A deacon is called to serve hand-in-hand with pastors in congregations. They are trained, called, empowered and entrusted rostered ministers of the Church. A deacon makes the connection between the faith community and the world more intentional. This connection explores the world and brings the stories of the world's need to the people of God as participants in the world God created. Deacons serve in specialized ministries, both within the congregation and in the world, including Faith Formation, Administration, Music, social Services and Chaplaincy.

Deacons have an important role in the church. Ministers of word and service are called to be servants in interpreting and meeting needs, hopes and concerns with the church and in the world. The value to the church is in service. Deacons are to lead the church in ministry and to be a voice for all.

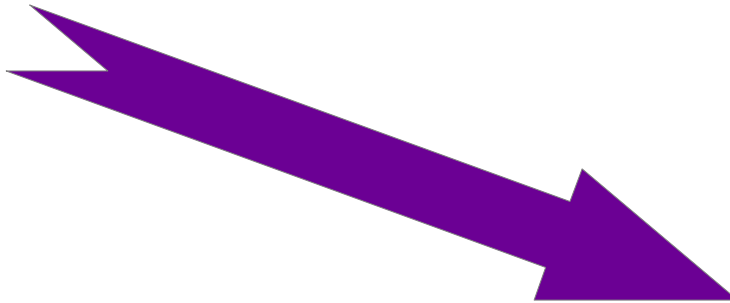

In this 1938 picture of our sanctuary, Notice the balcony banisters, they are spindles with curtains. There are two aisles that the choir and the brides would process down the right one and recess out the left one until 1997. The old organ sat behind the choir, the old windows on either side were still there until 1952 when the new organ went in. There is a curtain over the door to the sacristy off the altar area. There was a step up to the altar while the pastors benches were down a step. Those levels were changed in 1997. Wood was added to the walls on the left of the altar to match the altar wood. Lectern sat on an addition to the top step and the Baptismal font was in front of it on the floor
