One of the ways that Zion has been living into our mission of worshiping and working together across generations happens in this season of the Church year. For decades it has been the practice of Zion to have the youth of the congregation participate in the volunteering roles for our midweek Lenten services. I know much has changed about confirmation class over the decades, but this practice has remained consistent, and I strongly encourage it.

The second-best place to be formed in the faith is in worship. Both being present for worship and helping to lead our services encourages our confirmation students and high school youth to be part of who we are as a congregation. As we have begun to open youth leadership to other times of the year, please know that this is a natural outcome from inviting them to help lead our service. They'll want to do it more and more!

The best place to be formed in the faith? At home. Even when confirmation class was three hours on Wednesday and three hours on Saturday morning, our children and youth still spend most of their time at home. So just for the basic quantity of time, how you as parents and grandparents live your faith at home will have more of an impact on your children's faith than anything we do in confirmation class.

This Lent, I ask you to pay close attention to how you are a faith formation specialist. The way you live your faith in the presence of your children and grandchildren, nieces and nephews will have more of an impact on them than any sermon I preach or any vacation Bible school week. What you do at home, how you participate in worship and at Zion, what you talk about in the car, all these are more powerful moments to shape the faith of those younger than you. This is part of what I mean when I say you are a leader.

You are a leader because you will lead those of younger generations into a way of living life that reflects your own. This includes what they believe and how they express their faith to the next generations. Live the faith that God has given you as we worship and work together across generations.

SCAASP (Sandusky Churches Adopt A School Partnership) will reinvent itself at Zion by name only! Our Zion Team, under the parent organization, has been successfully serving Osborne school since it's adoption in 2011 and will continue to do so.



It was becoming increasingly clear that the organization was losing adopted churches and school volunteers. The SCAASP Board and CEO made the decision to disband in January.



Everything you need to know about Tithe.ly

1 - How can I give to my church?

You can download the Tithe.ly giving app where you will be able to find your church and give! It only takes a couple minutes to set up your account and then you'll be able to see your giving history and manage your account. You can also give online by visiting the Tithe.ly website.

2 - Does it cost me anything?

Nope! It costs you nothing to give to your church using Tithe.ly.

3 - Is my Credit / Debit card information secure?

Yes! We take data and payment information security very seriously. All sensitive financial information is stored with bank level security. All information transmitted to our banking partner and on our site is done via an encrypted HTTPS (SSL) connection; and stored by our banking partner to PCI DSS Level 1 compliant standards.

4 - How will my data be used?

Your personal data will *never* be sold, traded, or given out to third parties.

5 - How will I know when my credit, debit, or ACH is charged?

Anytime you're charged you will receive an email confirmation.

6 - How long does it take for my church to receive my gift?

It usually takes about 2-3 days between the time you give and when it appears in your church's bank account.

7 - What if I accidentally type the wrong amount?

If you make a mistake giving, make sure to contact your church and they can refund the wrong amount, and then you can make another donation for the correct amount. Refunds may take up to 7 business days to appear back in your account.

8 - How do I edit my information?

You can download the Tithe.ly giving app where you will be able to manage and update all of your account information.

9 - How do I change/cancel my recurring gift?

In order to change your auto recurring gift fund/designation, you will need to delete your existing recurring gift and then setup a new recurring gift.

10 - How do I change/update my payment method?

If you already have an account with Tithe.ly and would like to change your payment information, you can do so from the Tithe.ly app or by logging into your account online and clicking on "Payment Methods" in the menu bar. You will need to delete your old form of payment and add a new one. For a step-by-step walk through of this you can learn more here.

Through the Sundays in Lent leading up to Palm/Passion Sunday, we'll take time to look at most of the volunteer positions we have that make our Sunday services work. (The Altar Guild and Children's' Message are the exceptions because they take more than an hour to present.)

Getting Started with Tithe.ly Text Giving

[Tithe.ly text giving](#) is incredibly simple and fast. With [Tithe.ly](#) text giving you will be able to give in seconds. Simply text an amount (eg \$100) to (844)683-7315 and you've donated!

How it works:

To begin using text giving, just text the word "Give" to (844)683-7315. After this you can use text giving by texting any of the below options to your dedicated giving number.

Simply text (without the quotes):

1. A number to give that amount. Eg: "100".
2. A number and fund to designate your gift. Eg: "100 Radio Fund".
3. A number and schedule for automated giving. Eg: "500 Monthly", "100 Tithe Bimonthly", "50 Offering Weekly", or "250 Fortnightly".
4. "Cancel Auto" to cancel automated giving.
5. Add "cover" to cover fees of one transaction. Ex: "100 General Fund cover".
6. Add "Cover fees on" to cover fees on ALL text gifts..
7. "Cover fees off" to turn off cover fees on all text gifts.
8. "Card" to add a new payment method.
9. "Refund" to refund your last transaction.
10. "Options" to see the initial list of options again.

Zion has four funds to which you can direct your offering through text giving:

- General Fund
- Capital Campaign
- Facilities Fund
- Radio Fund

So you can follow the example of number 2 above using any of those options. Of you just text an amount, that will go to the General Fund.

Giving to Multiple Funds at Once

Here's how to use tithe.ly to donate to multiple funds/giving types at one time.



[Tithe.ly](#) makes it simple for you to give to up to four funds at once when logged into your Tithe.ly account.

Giving to multiple funds can be done from the [Tithe.ly](#) app or from the web. The below instructions show how this can be done.

From the [Tithe.ly](#) app and web:



- Open the [Tithe.ly](#) app on your smartphone, or login to your [Tithe.ly](#) account, or give through your church's website.
- Make sure the organization you'd like to give to, appears at the top. If it doesn't you can click on "find nearest church" or use the search bar located at the top to find and select your organization.
- Click on the "Give Now" button.
- Once on the giving form, look for the icon of a + sign with words "Add Gift" next to it.
- Click on that link to add a new gift. (You can add up to four new gifts)
- Note: You can then click on the icon of a - sign to remove an additional gift.
